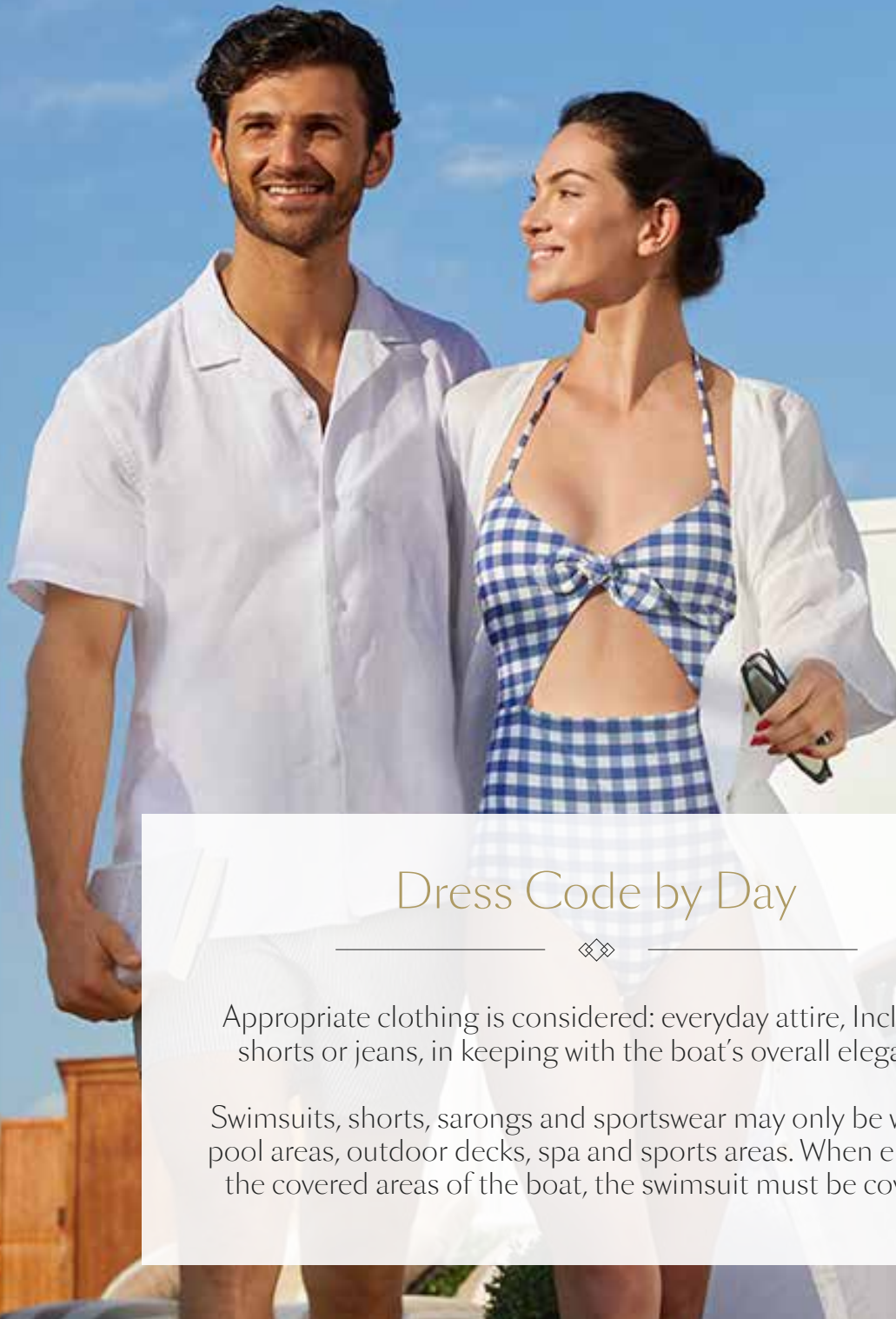

Important



- Patter will indicate each day the type of clothing required depending on whether it is a casual formal or casual night.
- A 7 day cruise usually have two formal nights; 14 days 4 formal nights, in navigation days.
- Please note that from 18:00 onwards, shorts, casual or sports outfits, sandals or sleeveless shirts (for men) are not suitable for the boat.
- Passengers wishing to dress more casually may use Kings Court restaurants, the main Lido buffet or the Winter Garden or Garden Bar areas, but must not access other areas within the ship, including alternative restaurants, in order to be Respectful to other guests.
- Under specific circumstances mentioned in the Patter, on some informal nights, for example outdoor parties or arrival of passengers on late flights, it may not be mandatory to wear a jacket that night. This occurs on a small number of occasions and does not imply general changes to the Cunard Dress Code.
